### MUTN October Year II Kickstart Workshop:

On October 2-3 2008 we had a highly successful workshop with 50 people in attendance. The theme was: *"Increasing Employment of Persons with Disabilities and Older Adults through Community and Small Business Changes"*. We had 18 MUTN Communities represented; speakers from the North as well as from Vancouver, Victoria, Nanaimo and Radium Hot Springs. We had guest speakers from the Ministry of Housing and Social Development, the Canadian Mental Health Association, Home Depot, 2010 Legacies Now: Measuring Up and 2010 Legacies Now: Accessible Tourism, Prince George Chamber of Commerce, Pirsell and Associates, Ministry of Healthy Living and Sport. ### PRESS RELEASE from Quesnel

With the installation of automatic door openers at the Quesnel Curling Club our community took another step in the direction of becoming "the most disability-friendly and senior friendly community in the North". This is the goal the Measure up Quesnel Committee set itself when it undertook to do an assessment of the challenges faced by Quesnel residents with disabilities and seniors.

Earlier this year the Quesnel and District Child Development Centre partnered with the City of Quesnel to apply for a grant from 2010 Legacies Now. This grant allowed the

committee to hire a project coordinator to undertake an in-depth community assessment of the city's accessibility needs and to develop a strategic plan to address those needs. In the course of her work Liz Neave facilitated 8 focus groups comprised of 100 people. In addition she interviewed many other individuals hearing directly from them about the issues they face in accessing the things they need in our community. Her report written with the support of the Measure Up Quesnel Committee contains a number of strategies for reaching the goal of becoming a more attractive place for seniors and people with disabilities to live.

The strategic plan which is available on the Child Development Centre's website or on the City of Quesnel Website represent the most in-depth examination of accessibility issues faced by people with disabilities and seniors ever undertaken in Quesnel and will provide us with a set of goals and the strategies for reaching them.

The automatic door openers at the Curling Club were made possible by a 5000 dollar grant from 2010 Legacies Now and 1750 dollars from each of the two Rotary Clubs. This is not the first time the two Rotary clubs have teamed up to address accessibility needs in Quesnel. A few years ago they were instrumental in raising money to purchase and install lifting and tracking at the recreation centre. This equipment makes it possible for those with mobility challenges to gain access to the swimming pool.

## **Funding News:**

**Everybody Active Seed Grants:** The BC Healthy Living Alliance ‘Everybody Active Seed Grants’ aim to increase physical activity among individuals who live in disadvantaged situations by encouraging communities to work together and advocate for policies and programs that remove barriers to participation. Everybody Active will award 60 seed grants of \$1,500 each, totaling \$90,000, to communities and non-profit organizations across BC. These grants are stepping-stone funds to support community mobilization around access to physical activity for adults, age 35-54.

The purpose of these funds is to bring stakeholders together, to discuss, learn and plan for communitywide action to increase access to physical activity in the target age group. These funds are not for implementing programs or services or subsidizing participation.

## **2009 Age-friendly Community Planning Grant Program**

Age-friendly Community Planning grants are intended to assist local governments in British Columbia to best support aging populations, develop and implement policies and plans that enable seniors to age in place and facilitate the creation of age-friendly communities. Eligible applicants are local governments (municipalities and regional districts) in British Columbia. Applications that indicate working collaboratively with one or more partner (e.g. health authority, board of education, community-based organization, First Nation or Aboriginal organization or other local government) will be ranked higher. The maximum grant is \$10,000 and matching funds and/or cost sharing are not required. Recognizing that older persons benefit from many of the same supports that also benefit persons with disabilities, the Age-Friendly Communities Initiative is encouraging Measuring Up communities to get involved.
